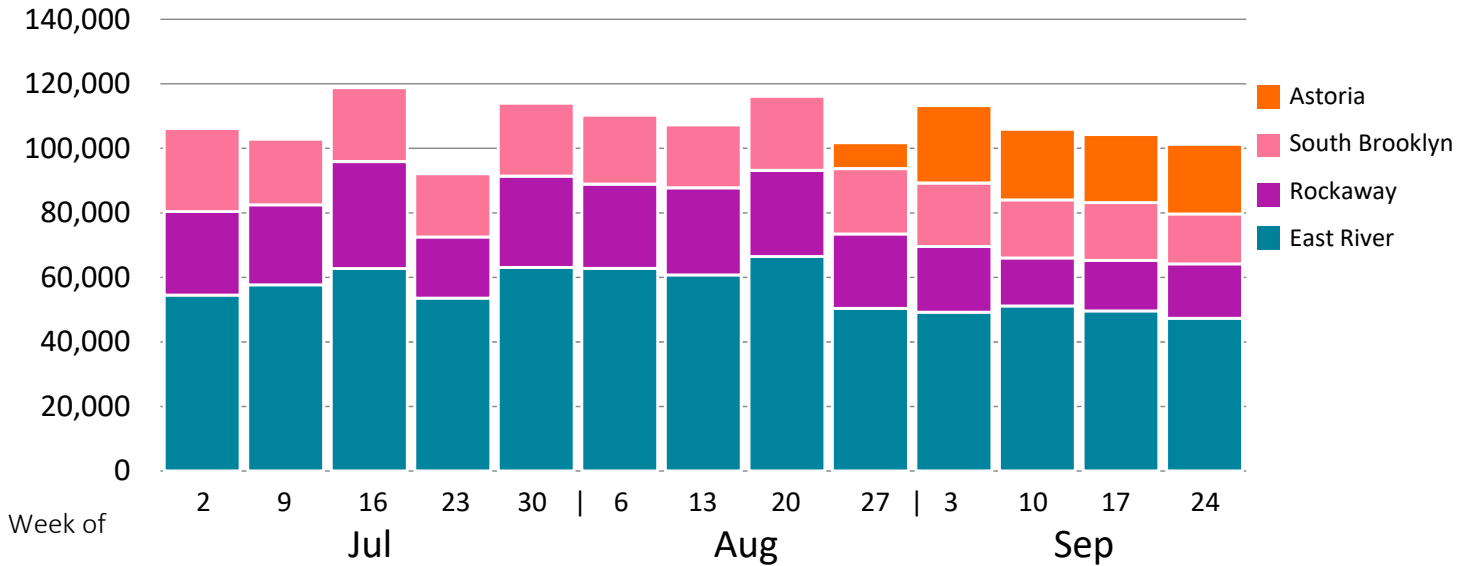

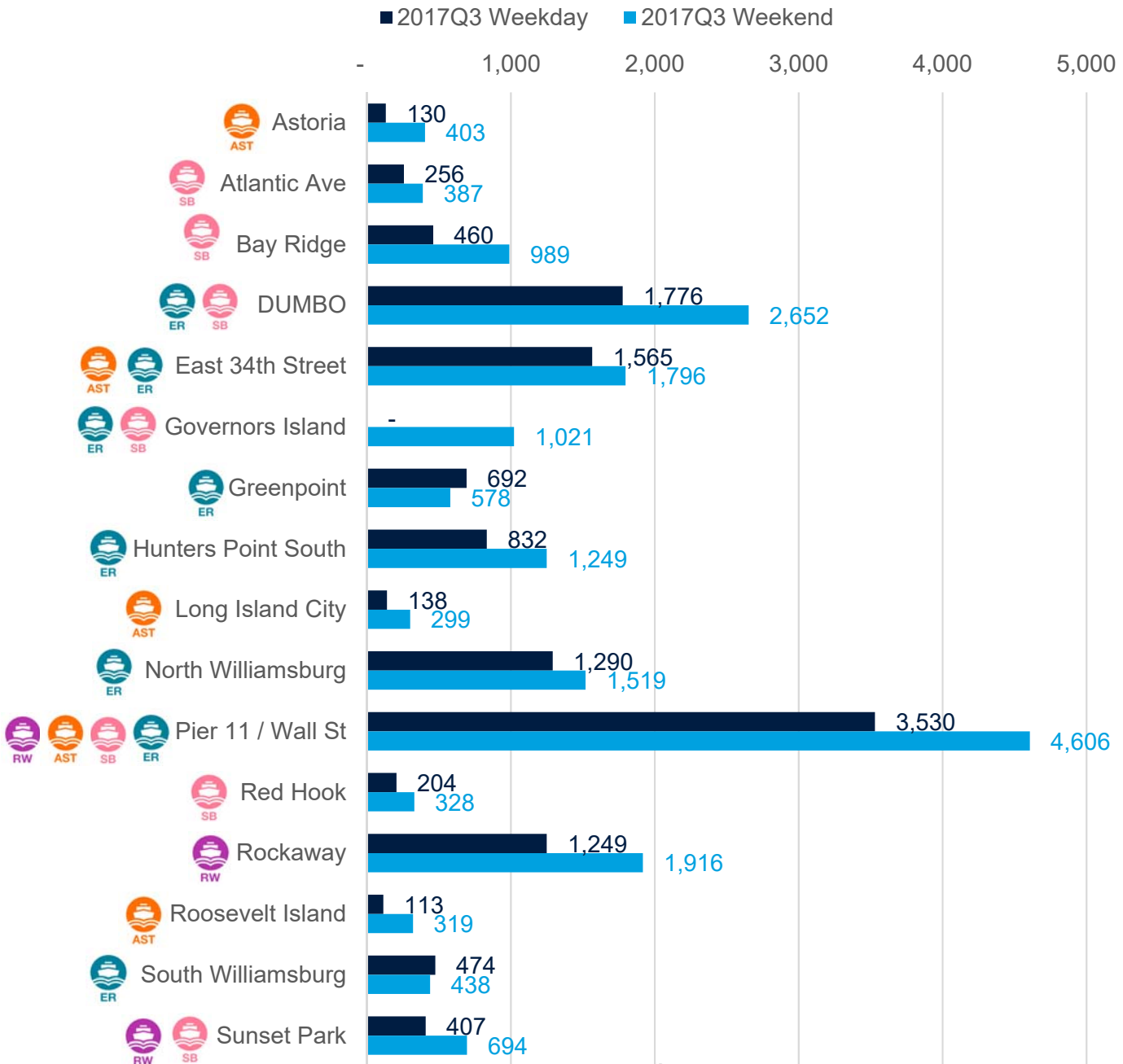

☰ Highlights

By late July, NYC Ferry carried over 1 million passengers. In August 2017, NYC Ferry introduced the Astoria route which saw consistent weekday ridership. In response to high demand on both routes, NYC Ferry operated additional trips on weekends and peak ridership days.

🔔 Notices

The UN General Assembly took place over three weeks in September and led to delays on the Astoria and East River routes due to harbor restrictions near the UN.

<sup>1</sup>On Time Performance is calculated as the percentage of stops made within the quarter that depart no more than 1 minute before and arrive no more than 5 minutes past their scheduled times. This report includes delays due to events outside of the control of NYC Ferry, such as vessel traffic, river closures/obstructions, extreme weather conditions, and other U.S. Coast Guard restrictions. When tracking devices are offline, the stops are excluded from the calculation. <sup>2</sup>Number of NYCF-branded vessels available for use; NYCF Partners with other operators to charter vessels at times of high demand. <sup>3</sup>NYCF operates to Governors Island on weekends during its public season.
